FUNCTION AND CATERING SUB-COMMITTEE

At its meeting on 21/12/2015, the Management Committee established this sub-committee to replace the Fundraising and Social Sub-committee by adopting the following By-Law.

Function and Catering Sub-Committee

The function of this Sub-Committee, subject to directions from the Management Committee, is to determine the format for functions (not Congresses) and organise catering and helpers for functions and Congresses.

Membership shall consist of a Chair appointed by the Management Committee, a member of the Management Committee, the Providor (ex-officio) and the President (ex officio), Depending on the function, additional members will be the Congress Convenor, the Director of the session involved and the Chief Tournament Director or their nominees. It is expected that the Chair will also invite some club members who may be assisting at a function to join the Sub-Committee temporarily for discussions and planning.

Leonie Spence accepted an invitation from the Management Committee to be Chair of this sub-committee and Desley Hanrahan was appointed as the Management Committee member of the sub-committee. Thanks to both of you for taking on these roles.

Sessions for 2016

Whilst I like to think that I am quite innovative, those that know me would also know that I am a conservative soul at heart. So it was with mixed feelings that I engaged in discussion with my fellow Directors and Management Committee members in planning for the future playing sessions of the club.

We started so many years ago as an amalgamation of three bridge clubs – the Toowoomba Bridge Club, the City Bridge Club and the Downs Bridge Club; and these groups naturally tended to play on "their" days. Thirty-four years later and we are a bit the same. Once players start in a session, they restructure their lives to play regularly in that session – and rarely change.

Recently the Management Committee received from a Working Party the first iteration of its Strategic Plan, and some of the data and ensuing recommendations have a direct influence on our playing schedule, with an evident focus on getting members to play in different sessions (and perhaps more sessions).

So, based on all the above and after discussion with a number of members, we are moving toward having graded sessions so that new and established members will have an opportunity to, and will feel comfortable at most sessions. Of course, there have to be enough table numbers to make grading viable.

Monday afternoon

This will be a "graded" session. There will be an Open section (open to anyone) and a beginners section (just as there is now) and if numbers permit there will be a middle section as well. Approximate divisions might be 0-10 master points, 10-30, and Open. The lower grades will be protected but anyone can choose to play in a higher section if they wish. We will still label one day per month as **invitational**, and these will not be graded to encourage players to mix. At many clubs who run graded sessions, the players tend to grade themselves and I think this is most likely what will happen here too.

A non-playing Director will be in charge of this session – so you may come without a partner. The Director will arrange partnerships or may fill-in themselves.

Tuesday daytime (10:30-2:30)

This will run the same as 2015, a single session duplicate pairs.

Tuesday night

This will run the same as 2015, with mostly pairs and some teams events.

Wednesday morning – intermediate supervised

A short popular session for the more experienced beginner. "Supervised" means you can ask for advice and may consult your notes if necessary. Ian Jesser gives a short talk each week on conventions and card play issues. No partner needed.

Wednesday afternoon

A "graded" session, most likely with two sections. "Invitational" once per month.

Thursday afternoon

This will run the same as 2015, with mostly pairs and some teams events.

Thursday night - Restricted

This will run with the same general format as 2015, for players with less than 150 master points. We will divide into two graded sections if the number of tables permit ... Mostly to accommodate those players straight out of lessons. A non-playing Director runs this session, so you may come without a partner, and one will be arranged for you or you may get stuck with me.

Friday morning

This will run as two sections. The first will be a Supervised Play section specifically for beginners (less than 10 master points) and a Restricted sessions for players up to 150 master points. Non-playing Director will help arrange partnerships – but primary focus is on the Supervised Play section.

Friday afternoon

This will run the same as 2015, but will be graded if the number of tables allows this.

Saturday afternoon

This will run the same as 2015, but there will be no play the day before any major local event. Check the club Bridge Diary or website or ask one of the Directors.

Special events

The Grand National Open Teams (GNOT) is one of the top national events in Australia – with an opportunity for you to play in it at your local club for **gold** master points. This year we are trying a new format. There will be three qualifying heats: Tuesday Night (5&12 Apr), Wednesday Afternoon (10&17 Feb) and Saturday Afternoon (4&11 Jun) – and you will earn gold master points per win in these events. The top half of each qualifying field will then be eligible to play in the Club Elimination heat (on Sunday 24 July) to determine

which team/s will play in the Zone Final on 21 August.

We will also be running the Patrons Day, Clive Berghofer Pairs, Club Pairs and Club Teams Championships, Col Martin Shield, Joyce Benson Cup, Ivy Dahler Cup, Ivy Dahler Novice Pairs and Ivy Dahler Novice Teams.

We will also host our five Congresses (Butler Pairs, Swiss Teams, Novice Pairs, Novice Teams and our Long Weekend Congress in October), and there are plenty of Congresses at our near neighbours (Darling Downs, Dalby, Lockyer, Warwick and Goondiwindi).

It looks like an exciting bridge year!!!






BRIDGE CLUB LIBRARY

So it doesn't help if in between boards they ignore the opposition and only talk about what they "should" or "could" have done. If this happens people feel as though they might as well be invisible and don't matter much. And I know it is not done to be intentionally rude.

When I am taken down because of some stupid thing I did, the first thing I always do is congratulate them, then I give myself a good kick and boasting about getting a top also doesn't help. So let's not forget, that "good" players once upon a time, were also new players and relied on the encouragement of better players to improve their game.

WORKSHOPS FOR 2016

Transfers

I notice people are playing transfers who understand how to do the transfer, but then have a limited understanding of what happens next or how to show a 5-4 in the majors or how to show a 5-5 in the majors. What does super accept mean? Why should you transfer in the minors and when?

Hamilton (Capaletti)

Interference over a strong NT. What are the responses by your partner? How to cope with Hamilton when your partner has opened 1NT.

Gerber with CRO responses

A variation of the Gerber convention, where certain pairs of Aces can be identified.

Roman Keycard Blackwood

A variation of the Blackwood convention, when the partnership has agreed on a trump suit and is interested in slam.

- Only **green** and **blue** systems are permitted in club events.
- System cards are compulsory for competitions and red master point events and strongly recommended for all other sessions.
- No notices are permitted on the noticeboards unless approval is given from the club Executive.
- No trading is permitted on the club premises unless written permission is given via the Management Committee
